

Virtual/Homebased Instructional Model

Our virtual learning for 5th grade will be taught by one of our Latta Middle School teachers. Students will access each of their classes through Google Classroom at home. Students will have four core classes: Math, Science, Language Arts, and Social Studies and will use the schedule below to login to each class. Students will also have an elective class which will be accessed through Google Classroom. Assignments, quizzes, and tests will be turned in via Google Classroom, and the child's teacher will be grading each item. It is very important that your child maintain this schedule so that he/she will have a routine. Students need to be disciplined in this independent learning style as their grades will depend on their work ethic.

Your child's teacher will be available throughout the day Monday through Friday to answer questions and provide any assistance that your child needs. The teacher will provide your child with a username and password prior to the school year starting where he/she can access their classes and instructions on how to access their work.

Point of Emphasis: You and your child may communicate with the teacher throughout the week to ask questions about content or assignments or to troubleshoot any technology issues you may be experiencing. **You will be contacted daily by your teacher via email, phone or Google Meet.**

Face-to-Face Learning Model (2 Days Attend School/3 Days Work@Home)

If your child is attending school for Face-to-Face learning, he/she will attend school two days a week (Monday/Wednesday or Tuesday/Thursday). On the days that he/she *attends* school, students will follow a normal schedule like our traditional school days. Teachers will travel to the classes instead of the students moving to different classrooms. Students will be escorted to electives, and safety protocols will be followed.

Teachers will provide students with assignments on the “Work@Home” days when students do not attend school. Assignments may include work from textbooks, novels to read, worksheets, projects, practice problems, and homework. A schedule will be provided for the “Work@Home” days so that students can continue their routine and work on assignments during the time they would work on them at school. The schedule below is a sample of what the “Work@Home” days would look like:

A teacher or staff member will get back in touch with you to assist you with any questions or concerns you or your child may have during the day. **Your teacher will have contact with you every day.**
